- Bachelor of Architecture, University of Oklahoma, 1973.
- Master of Building Construction, graduate assistant, University of Florida, 1974.
- Adjunct Assistant Professor at the UF School of Building Construction, 1978-1980. Courses taught included:
 - Concrete Formwork, designing forms for buildings.
 - Timber Design, including wood beams and columns, joists and rafters, nails and screws.
 - Residential Construction Techniques, all trades except mechanical and electrical.
- Junior College Professor, Santa Fe Community College, Gainesville, Florida, taught courses in drafting, 1979 and again in 2001.
- Certified General Contractor, 1975.
- LEED Accredited Professional, 2008.
- Guest Lecturer UF Rinker School of Building Construction, taught Estimating two semesters 2011.

BUSINESS

- Owner/President of Anglin Construction, 1981 to present.
 - Volume of 4-7 million per year.
 - Bonded general construction, job size to \$4.5 mill.
 - Average 20 employees.
 - Completed projects include:
 - Poe Springs Park (\$750,000) Alachua County's premier park, consists of several single story stone buildings, boardwalks, parking lot.
 - The Reitz Union Colonnade (\$1.0 mill), a 10,000 sf addition to the Reitz Union.
 - Concrete subcontract for the McKnight Brain Institute (\$4.5 mill), a seven story building constructed on the University of Florida Campus by the construction manager McDivett Street Bovis. The project included a foundation mat pour of 4500 cubic yards lasting 17 hours, at that time the largest continuous pour in north Florida.
 - Kappa Sigma Fraternity (\$4.5 mill), three stories, 25,000 sf.
 - Scores of projects for city, county, state and federal government.
- Owner of the REUSER, a retail store, 1998-present.
 - New and used building products bought and sold.

 - About 15 houses were designed by Gary Anglin, plus one church.
 - When interest rates hit 18% in 1978 the company concluded operations.
